In these pages, we are pleased to share some of the incredible work our team did last year on behalf of domestic violence victim/survivors and many others in our community.

It was a unique year for Women's Advocates – on top of all the good work our staff does every day, we dug deep to develop a new strategic plan. Board members, staff, key community partners, and most importantly, domestic violence survivors, thought hard about our services and our purpose, what we do well, what we could do better. While we dream about a future when our services will no longer be needed, we know, sadly, that future is still far off. Every day, by working in these three areas, we at Women's Advocates live our mission of walking with victim/ survivors and our community to break the cycle of domestic violence. And every day we get a little bit closer to achieving our vision of a community free from violence, where all are safe and can live productive and healthy lives.



COMMUNITY EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

In the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year:

(Between July 1, 2018, and June 30, 2019)

5,966 students and professionals attended 313 domestic violence and related trainings.

43,773 unique visitors used safety resources from Women's Advocates' website.

98% of surveyed students who received training in schools reported they understood six different types of abuse and how to find resources for someone in need of safety.

Outreach expenses for the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year were \$57,410.

Outreach expenses comprised 2% of organizational expenses.

VIOLENCE PREVENTION

Women's Advocates' Outreach Program addresses domestic violence using a secondary prevention model - we work with victim/survivors of domestic violence, helping to make sure they do not continue to experience it. To increase pathways to safety for survivors, we deploy our outreach team into the community where we LIVE, LEARN, WORK, and GATHER. An Education and Outreach Coordinator and In-School Violence Prevention Educator are supported by a volunteer-led Safety Resource Crew that disseminates safety resources across the community. Safety resource trainings, awareness presentations, and advocacy workshops occur across the Twin Cities to create pathways to safety for victim/survivors of domestic violence. In 2018, Women's Advocates hosted a "Six Degrees of Connection" panel for social and human service providers, and presented at several conferences and summits for professionals in the community.

Only 1 in 3 teens who were involved in an abusive relationship confided in someone about the violence.


288 women and children received emergency shelter at Women's Advocates.

51 days was the average length of stay for residents.

Residents received **15,099** nights of shelter.

Shelter/facility expenses for the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year were \$679,050. Facilities expenses comprised 28% of organizational expenses.

EMERGENCY SHELTER

Three connected homes form the foundation of Women's Advocates' emergency shelter. One of these three homes was the very first shelter in the nation dedicated to women and children escaping domestic violence. Our space today has 15 bedrooms and typically provides emergency refuge to 17 women and up to 33 children nightly. Our kitchen serves three meals daily and residents have access to laundry facilities, a computer center, a welcoming common living room and dining room, and a secure children's playground. Women's Advocates is a secure place where a woman and her children can trust they will be safe 24/7 from physical harm and emotional trauma. Time at our shelter is time to breathe, focus, and plan for a safer future. Beginning on the day of arrival or soon thereafter, residents work with our on-site staff and programs to chart the course to a new chapter in their lives. Our space is productive, reflective, and supportive.

Intimate partner violence is the second most common form of victimization against people in Minnesota.

195 crisis interventions took place for women staying at our shelter.


Family advocates dedicated **2,556** hours of support to residents.

2,400 people called our 24/7 crisis line for help.

Crisis resource advocates provided 1,454 crisis interventions and shelter referrals via our crisis line.

Women's Program expenses for the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year were \$809,523. Women's Program expenses comprised 33% of organizational expenses.

WOMEN'S PROGRAM

The Women's Program is a comprehensive resource for survivors staying at our shelter and for callers to our 24/7 crisis line. Advocates and victims of domestic violence work together to plan for safety, address immediate crises, and build networks of support. Daily support groups and partnerships with the Domestic Abuse Legal Advocacy Center, Community Stabilization Project, Continuum Care Center, and Family Tree Clinic connect residents to health, legal and housing resources. Direct advocacy provides systems navigation for courts-related issues and public assistance programs, and assistance with housing and employment searches. Callers to Women's Advocates' 24/7 crisis line have access to experienced advocates so they can obtain emergency domestic violence shelter referrals, safety planning, and on-the-spot crisis interventions.

Women aged 18-34 have the highest risk of domestic violence victimization.

In the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year:

(Between July 1, 2018, and June 30, 2019)

166 children ages 0 to 17 stayed at Women's Advocates' emergency shelter.


160 children participated in family and educational activities.

Children received **2,117** hours of advocacy, activities, school enrollment, and assessments.

Women's Advocates provided an average of 13 hours of child care for each participating child.

Children's Program expenses for the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year were \$206,074. Children's Program expenses comprised 8% of organizational expenses.

SHEILA WELLSTONE CHILDREN'S PROGRAM

Our Sheila Wellstone Children's Program supports the children who arrive at our shelter with their mothers/caregivers. Through this program, children have access to safety planning, school support, family activities, art and music activities, and drop-in childcare. Sadly, 92% of children at Women's Advocates have witnessed/experienced domestic abuse. Children arriving at our shelter need a nurturing environment with a focus on predictability, healing, and space to be whatever age they are, whether they're infants, toddlers, preschoolers, or school-aged. Mothers at our shelter reported a 50% increase in community involvement (with schools, libraries, and mom groups) during their stay, which is critical for supporting the individual and community growth of their children beyond their shelter stay.

Many children exposed to violence in the home are also victims of physical abuse.


126 women and children participated in Aftercare, across 40 households.

- **22** participating households have maintained stable housing for 12 or more months.
- **22** participating households increased income through obtaining community benefits.
- 23 participating households increased income through employment.

Aftercare Program expenses for the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year were \$137,509.

Aftercare expenses comprised 6% of organizational expenses.

AFTERCARE

Our full-time Aftercare Advocate worked with families for six months to one year after leaving our shelter to identify and help mitigate risks to their safety and independence. We strive to support a woman from the moment she leaves her abuser through to a stable, safe, sustainable living environment. In this fiscal year, 40 employed, yet low-income families avoided the risks of homelessness and recurrent abuse as we nurtured positive relationships with landlords, provided resources and coached on tenants' rights, and ensured access to housing stability stipends when needed. Because of our rental assistance, women have been able to focus on enrollment in academic programs or more stable employment that may take longer to obtain. At the end of the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year, the Aftercare Program received an expansion grant to double its size and impact in future years.

84% of U.S. domestic violence shelters reported a need for finding affordable housing.

IMPACT IN THE 2018-2019 FISCAL YEAR

Preventing continued violence and increasing awareness

5,966 students and professionals attended **313** trainings on awareness and safety resources for domestic violence and related topics.

43,773 unique web visitors used safety resources from Women's Advocates' website.

Emergency shelter for people fleeing domestic violence

288 adults and children received 15,099 days of shelter. The average stay was 51 days.

Programming at the shelter for survivors

195 crisis interventions took place on behalf of the women staying at our shelter.
Family advocates provided 2,556 hours of individual support to residents at our shelter.
30% of exiting shelter residents gained housing resources through Women's Advocates.
63% of residents increased their income to meet their basic needs during their shelter stay.
100% of school-aged children attended school most of the time while living in shelter (compared to 65% of children at arrival).

60% of residents had strong community engagement by the time they left our shelter. An average of 13 hours of child care was provided for each participating child.

Resources for community members seeking safety

2,400 people called our 24/7 crisis line seeking safety and resources. **1,454** callers received crisis interventions and shelter referrals.

Sustained safety for residents leaving our shelter

- 40 households participated in the Aftercare Program.
- 22 households have maintained stable housing for 12 or more months.
- 22 households increased income through obtaining community benefits.
- 23 households increased income through employment.

2,803 hours of volunteerism took place at the shelter, averaging 7 hours per day.
2 interns provided research and development support, averaging 110 hours per intern.
57% of volunteerism is from individual visits, and 43% is from group visits.
