- Know your rights and responsibilities per your lease




Time of Rent Energy Disclosure- Starting in Minneapolis in 2021





- Available to renters and homeowners.
- Can be used for utility bills (electric and gas) and delivered fuels.
- Can help with emergency heating repairs.

- Apply each year in the fall through May 31. It is first come first served.

## **Use Less Energy: Winter**



Control room temperature

- Keep at 68° when home
- Reduce up to 10° while asleep or away, Never lower than 55°
- Use a programmable thermostat to make it easy to manage your temperature
- Use the sun to warm your home
- Wear layers
- Avoid or minimize space heater use



#### **Use Less Energy**



Turn off/unplug electronics when not used (avoid vampire use)



Consider power strips or smart strips



Use LED Light Bulbs



Run a full dishwasher, turn off heated drying; run full loads of laundry, wash with cold water
